HOLY WEEK AND EASTER SERVICES

Combined 9:30am services begin April 9th, Palm Sunday, and continue through Easter into the summer

Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. 24 Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. —John 12:23-24

In this upcoming month of April, we will be celebrating the greatest feast of the liturgical year and the most holy day in the Christian church—Easter—the commemoration of the resurrection of Christ and the celebration of all that Christ accomplished through his death, opening to us and to the whole world the way of everlasting life. Yet it is important for us to remember that the resurrection did not occur in a vacuum. In order for Christ to be brought again into life, he first had to suffer death. That is why we celebrate three other extremely important feast days during Holy Week, the week before Easter. We celebrate Maundy Thursday, the night before Christ died for us when he shared supper with the disciples and instituted the sacrament of the Eucharist, by which we are able to be partakers of Christ's body and blood, becoming one body with him and with each other. We celebrate Good Friday, the day that Christ was unjustly sentenced to death, was flogged and mocked and ridiculed, and then suffered the pain and humiliation of death by crucifixion. And we celebrate Holy Saturday, the day that Christ's body lay in the tomb—the day no human on earth had contact with Christ. The commemorations we hold during Holy Week serve as a potent reminder that we cannot have the glory of the resurrection without the suffering of the cross.

It seems very appropriate that as we travel through this important period in the liturgical year, we are experiencing parallels in our current work as a church. Since Advent we have been having discussions about the history and changing identity of our church, discussing our passions and our hopes and dreams for the future. With God's help we will be able to create a new mission statement together using this work as a foundation. This mission statement will help lead St. Thomas into the future. Yet just as we cannot experience the hope of the resurrection without the suffering of the cross, we will inevitably experience some pain as we make changes to fit the new vision for the future we are working to create—some things may have to die. It is important to remember that, as with the resurrection, the pain involved will be well-worth the glorious outcome.

Beginning Palm Sunday, April 9th, we will begin holding combined services so that we will celebrate Holy Week and Easter as one congregation. This combined service will continue through Easter Season into the summer. This will allow more people to be involved in our final series of discussions as we create a plan for our future. Sunday April 23rd, we will begin meeting after the 9:30am service to further discuss and discover our new mission statement. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend, even those who have been unable to attend previous sessions. If you have not already had a chance to take a look, summaries of the outcomes of our previous conversations can be found on the wall in the fellowship hall. Please join us in these discussions and lend your voice as we look forward to this season of resurrection.
